I will make a charge for the participation fee on 9 August in Japanese yen. Itineraries:

9 August.

8:00 Departure beside the entrance of APA Hotel.

10:40 Visit to the Museum of *Mino* Washi/Japanese paper. "*Mino*" is the ancient name of the south half region of current Gifu prefecture. Observation, Experience of paper making, Lunch and Visit to a house and mill of the artisan, Masashi Sawamura. Until 13:50

14:40 Visit to the regional Development Bureau of Meiho District in Gujo municipality. Exchange with the head of the office, dwellers and NGO members. Until 17:00

17:30 Stay at the Yshida-ya Hotel in the central area of Gujo-Hachiman Castle Town. As single rooms are only three and others are twin rooms (two-bed rooms), I would like some single participants are ready to stay and share a twin room. Gujo-Hachiman is famous for the Bon dancing. After dinner (19:00) we will sightsee the townscape and enjoy the Bon dancing at "Imamachi" community.

On 9 August Prof Koichi Togashi, Gifu University will guide and tell us the promotion and exchange activities practiced in and around the regions on our itineraries with goodwill.

10 August.

7:30 Breakfast

8:30 Walk and visit to the Hachiman Castle at the hilly site. Until 9:45.

10:00 Departure from Gujo-Hachiman Castle Town

11:00 Visit to "Miboro" rock-fill Dam and Reservoir. MIBORO Dam-side Park "Miboro Electric Power Hall".

174households (230 houses) were submerged and about 1,200people had to move. Until 11:45

12:30 Visit to "Shirakawa-go" traditional steep thatched roof houses ("Gassho"-style houses and settlement).

Free time until 14:30. World herirage. During it observation and lunch is to be enjoyed at will.

15:30 Visit to the Taira Local Museum in Nanto municipality, Toyama prefecture. Until 16:30

17:00 Stay at "Ainokura" settlement with traditional steep thatched roof houses (World heritage). A guest house with traditional steep thatched roof named "Nakaya" is reserved by our group. Its manager, that is,

the head of the household is the chief of the conservation group of "Ainokura" community. After dinner he will tell us its local history. The bath is common. We can take a bath at any time until midnight. We may need to decide order when to take a bath.

11 August.

7:00 Breakfast. Free time until the Departure time at 8:30

9:30 Visit to Inami temple-gate town. Two hundred wood carvers live there. Visit to the temple, Exhibition of wood carving, Lunch. Until 12:30.

13:00 Visit to the Tonami Museum. Tonami Region is famous for dispersed settlements. The observation site named "Yumeno-daira" commands a good view of dispersed settlements. The head of the Tonami Museum, Masao Shindo will show us the structure and elements of an "Einödhof" of a dispersed settlement at his house. Until 16:00

17:00 First break-up point in front of the Toyama JR station. (For those who go to Tokyo)

18:30 Second break-up point in front of the Kanazawa JR station

22:00 Final break-up point in front of the Kyoto JR station
